IN FLANDERS FIELDS

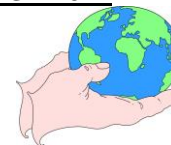
*In Flanders fields the poppies blow

Dear Parents/Guardians:

When schools are closed or buses cancelled due to extreme weather conditions, details will be announced on the Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board website (www.hwcdsb.ca) and Hamilton-Wentworth Student Transportation Services website (www.hamiltonschoolbus.ca/public_v2/index.aspx) as well as the following Hamilton and area media outlets:

Schools closures and bus cancellations will be posted on the HWCDSB and HWSTS websites and communicated to the local media by 7:00 a.m., whenever possible. If schools close early, the information will be posted on the HWCDSB and HWSTS websites and sent to the media for dissemination. In addition, each school will initiate its own procedures for notifying parents of early closures due to inclement weather.

We ask parents/guardians to take notice of the following guidelines:

- In the event of impending severe weather conditions, parents should consider the safety of their children in deciding whether or not to send them to school;
- Parents should stay tuned to Hamilton and area radio stations for weather reports and school board announcements;
- Parents who, in spite of bus cancellation, drive their children to school, should ensure that their children can get into the school and will be required to make the necessary arrangements for the safe return home of their children at the end of the day or in the event of an early closure. Buses which do not run in the morning will not run for the rest of the day;
- Phone calls to the school during severe weather conditions are to be made only in the case of extreme emergency;
- Parents shall be requested to provide the school with the name and telephone number of a neighbour alternate, (someone who lives in close proximity to the home) who would be willing to act on their behalf in the event that they cannot be reached.

RESTORATIVE PRACTICES & TOOLS FOR LIFE LEARNING COMMUNITY

We at St. Kateri Catholic Elementary School are excited to promote a Restorative Practices and Tools for Life Learning Community. These are processes that are proven to help achieve a positive school climate.

•Through “RESTORATIVE PRACTICES” and with the implementation of the “TOOLS FOR LIFE” philosophy comes the opportunity that allows us to collectively and collaboratively create a Christ-Centred, virtues-based school community made up of staff, students, parents, and community partners.

•Often when children are in kindergarten, first, second or third grade, they don’t know how to recognize or express their emotions if they’re frustrated or upset. •When this spills over into the classroom it can cause discipline issues. But by using a teaching method called “Tools for Life”, teachers at St. Kateri Catholic Elementary School are working with students to recognize and express these emotions and prevent negative behaviour.

•St. Kateri teachers and ECE (Grades K-3) are trained in using “Tools for Life”. They are incorporating this teaching method in their classroom as a way to help kindergartners, first, second and third graders recognize and properly express emotions.

•Our good practices are built upon approaches that are relationship building, relationship mending, and therefore “restorative” in nature. The intentional use of “RESTORATIVE PRACTICES” and “TOOLS FOR LIFE” improves teaching and learning environments, increases student time on task, and increases student achievement. Everyone benefits from spending more time on task, while learning the value of creating and participating in cultures of caring and community. All teaching and ECE staff have been trained in Restorative Practice.

•At St. Kateri “RESTORATIVE PRACTICES” and “TOOLS FOR LIFE” will reflect the principles of progressive discipline as outlined in Bill 212 and will be effective in conflict prevention, intervention and resolution.

Principles and Values of Restorative Practices and Tools for Life:

- Respecting individuals’ rights;
- Taking responsibility for our own behaviour;
- Believing that people can change; • Being open to supporting others who wish to change their behaviours;
- Believing that restorative responses are more helpful than retributive ones.

Restorative Questions:

The scripted conferencing model based upon relational and restorative questions is an internationally tried and tested process which delivers all of the elements of Restorative Practices. Restorative Questions: To respond to challenging behaviour:

- What happened?
- What were you thinking about at the time?
- What have your thoughts been since?
- Who has been affected by what you did?
- In what way have they been affected?
- What do you think you need to do to make things right?

The above questions will be used when applicable at St. Kateri when conflicts arise.
