Wet Weather, Two Shoe "Rule", and Proper Outdoor Clothing

Wet floors in the classroom are not only unsafe and unhealthy, but also very difficult to maintain. Also, with the colder weather upon us, we ask that parents ensure their children come to school dressed appropriately for this weather with a proper coat, gloves and hats to school each day.

ST. KATERI REMINDERS

STAYING INDOORS WHEN ILL

Frequently we receive request from parents to allow a child to remain indoors at recess or lunch hour due to illness or cold. When a child is well enough to come to school, they should be prepared to participate in all activities during the school day **including outdoor recess**.

SNOW THROWING POLICY

There is perhaps no other activity that has the potential to cause serious injury as throwing snowballs. Particles of ice, grit or stones can be imbedded in the snow without the person's knowledge and could result in head or eye injuries.

SNOW THROWING WILL NOT BE PERMITTED AT ST. KATERI SCHOOL

Students throwing snow will have very serious consequences. Safety is our primary concern. Please discuss the seriousness of throwing snow with your child.

SAFE DRINKING WATER

Results from 2017 water testing for schools of the Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board are now available. We are happy to report that lead testing results for St. Kateri Tekakwitha C.E.S. have met the Ontario drinking water quality lead standard of 10 micrograms per litre (10 µg/L) or below.

Since 2007, Ontario law has required child care centres and schools to flush their plumbing and test their drinking water for lead. As of July 1, 2017, an amendment to the Safe Drinking Act, 2002, of Ontario Regulation 243/07: Schools, Private School and Child Care Centres now requires schools housing children under the age of 18 to conduct annual standing and flushed water testing. The expectation is that all drinking fountains and water fixtures in schools used for drinking or in the preparation of food will be tested within a three-year period. Thereafter, schools and child care centres need only test one fixture per year. In the interests of the safety of our students and staff, the HWCDSB has opted to test 100% of its fixtures in the first year of the regulation. Testing for all fixtures in all schools was conducted in June 2017.

ALLERGIN SENSITIVE SCHOOL



St. Kateri Tekakwitha school is a place where all children feel safe and have a sense of belonging. To ensure the safety and well-being of all children, please note below important information from Anaphylaxis Canada:

- Anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that is rapid in onset and may cause death;
- Signs and symptoms of a severe allergic reaction can occur within minutes of exposure to an allergen (a substance capable of causing an allergic reaction)
- Very small amounts of certain foods can cause severe reactions when eaten. This may happen if a person at risk touches an allergenic substance and then subsequently touches the mouth. Even a very small amount 'hidden' in a food or transferred to a serving utensil has the potential to cause a severe allergic reaction. Direct ingestion of an allergy-causing food poses the greatest risk for people with food allergies.

Cooperation from parent and guardians in adhering to the guidelines below is most appreciated:

- There are students at this school who are allergic to the following foods and items: peanuts, nuts, tree nuts, eggs, milk and shellfish.
- Reinforce hand washing practices: wash hands before and after eating.
- Remind children not to share or trade food, food utensils, or food containers.
- Please do NOT bring any home-made food products into the school; with permission, non-food items are permitted for various celebrations and special events and activities.

Thank you for your help in keeping all our children safe.
